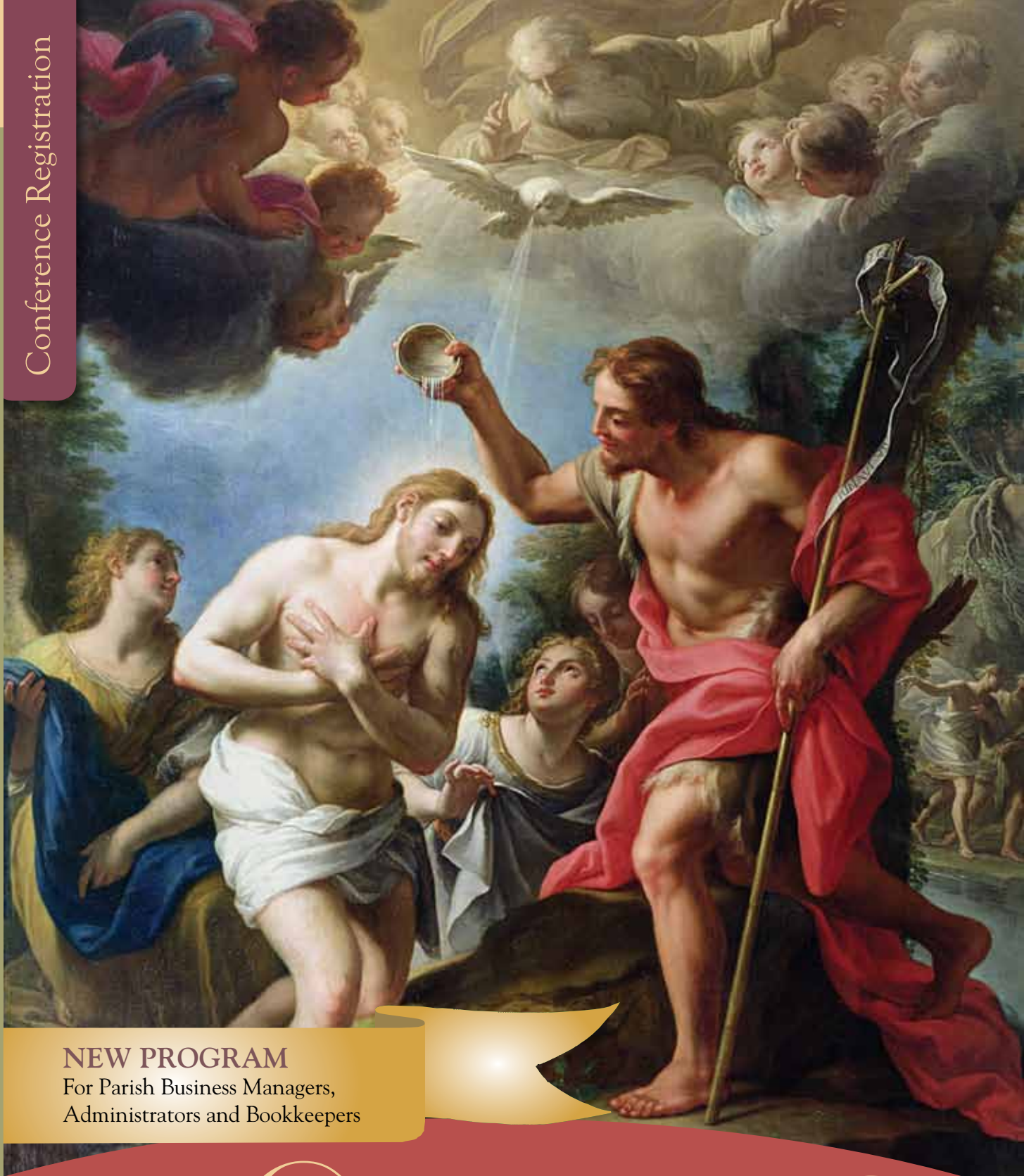

Living Our Baptismal Call

The theme for the International Catholic Stewardship Council's 2009 conference is *Stewardship: Living Our Baptismal Call*. In the United States bishops' pastoral letter on Christian stewardship they teach that stewardship involves embracing a Christ-centered way of living which has its beginning in the sacrament of baptism. This biblically commissioned sacrament is the foundation of our call to be good stewards and to proclaim by word and deed the Good News of Jesus Christ.

The ICSC conference provides a host of opportunities to learn how stewardship encourages us to proclaim the Good News. The conference will reveal how sacred liturgy and parish life work together to nurture and promote stewardship in our family of faith. The many presenters will also invite us to reflect on ways to grow in our Catholic faith and to understand how stewardship calls us to open our hearts to God and take our faith even deeper.

The image we use this year is that of the *Baptism of Christ* by the 17th century Italian painter Francesco Trevisani. With his baptism Jesus entered his public ministry as a servant of his Father. From the moment Jesus descends into the waters of the Jordan his life is changed forever. He is fully obedient to his Father through the Holy Spirit. His life is totally one of mission; a life that becomes a life for us. In our annual baptismal renewal, we enter into Jesus' baptism. We once again express a willingness to become obedient with him who does the will of his Father under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. We "put on Christ." That is the steward's way. That is what our conference is all about.

New Track

Parish Business Managers, Administrators and Bookkeepers – Sessions in this **NEW TRACK** are now available for those entrusted with the stewardship of managing and administering the overall business and temporal affairs of a parish, and the practical ways their special leadership role supports the mission and spiritual life of the parish.

Tracks

Conference sessions will be presented concurrently in the eight tracks described below.

- 1 Introduction to Christian Stewardship** – This track is designed to be a primer on stewardship. The sessions offer a general introduction to the theology, spirituality and biblical foundations of Christian stewardship as well as offer a model that parish leaders can reflect on as they begin to introduce their parishioners to stewardship.
- 2 Reinigorating Parish Stewardship** – Sessions in this track will be especially helpful to pastors and parish leaders who have already introduced stewardship in their parishes and are looking for creative ways to enhance and improve their ongoing stewardship efforts.
- 3 Practical Stewardship** – Designed to offer conference attendees an opportunity to be exposed to an in-depth treatment on topics of Christian stewardship that would not necessarily be covered in the first two tracks. This track offers a number of sessions that are for personal enrichment or ministerial growth.
- 4 Living the Pastoral Letter** – This track will resemble a general elective track, where stewardship-related issues are explored such as evangelization, liturgy, Christian service, or perhaps the life of stewardship introduced in a country outside North America or another topical theme related to stewardship and the life of the church.
- 5 Nivel en Español (Spanish Language)** – Presentado en español, como introducir y fomentar de modo eficaz la corresponsabilidad en la comunidad parroquial. (Presented in Spanish, this track will offer effective ways to introduce and sustain stewardship in the parish.)
- 6 Primer for Diocesan Professionals** – This track is designed especially for new diocesan stewardship and development officers and for those seeking a refresher in various topics. The first session will offer a basic theology of church and stewardship in order to help the diocesan officers understand their unique role within the local Church.
- 7 Advanced Issues for Diocesan Professionals** – This track offers more in-depth presentations for seasoned diocesan officers on issues that will impact their work and enhance their professional skills.
- 8 Diocesan Director Forum** – The forums are specifically designed to provide opportunities for diocesan development and stewardship officers to come together in a more personal setting and share issues of professional interest and to reflect on common concerns.

REGISTRATION

What does my registration fee include?

Are there any registration discounts?

Yes, there are two ways to save.

Member discount - ICSC members receive discounted registration fees. All registrants from a member parish or diocese may register at the member rate.

Early bird discount - Register by July 31 and receive an additional \$50 discount on each registration.

Can I become a member and register for the conference at the same time?

How can I register for the conference?

What are the payment options?

What is the cancellation policy?

Any registration cancellation received by August 1, 2009 will be eligible for refund less a \$100 administrative fee. Without exception all cancellations before August 1, 2009 must be requested in writing. PLEASE NOTE THAT THERE ARE NO REFUNDS AFTER AUGUST 1, 2009. Postmark determines deadline.

Can I send someone in my place if I can no longer attend?

Yes, please be sure to tell us your replacement's name and contact information before the conference.

What if we want to take advantage of the early bird registration rates but we're not sure who will be attending?

You may register now and submit the name of the attendee no later than October 1, 2009.

Is there single-day registration?

No, ICSC does not offer single-day or single session registrations for the annual conference.

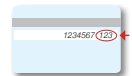

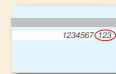
